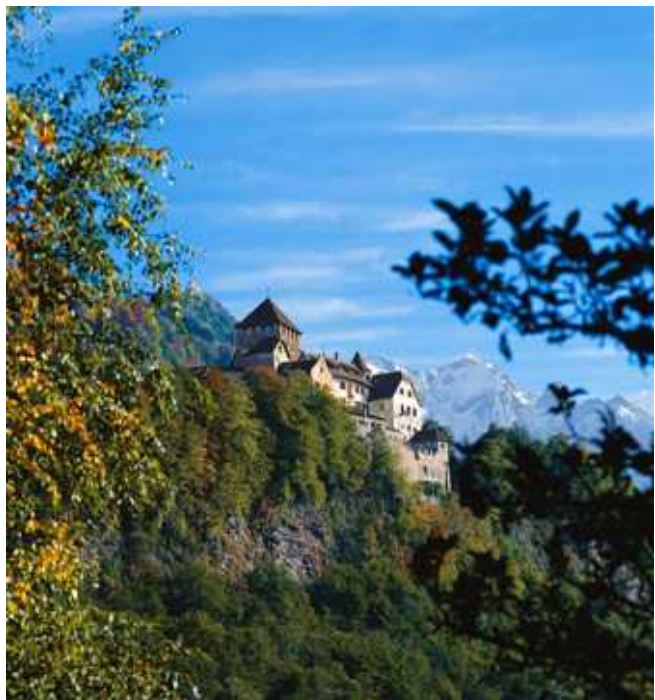

London, England - After touring the “City of London” (financial district) students will attend seminars about Retailing at Harrod's; Insurance/Risk Management at Lloyd's of London; and see trading on the floor of the Metal Exchange. Then you will have time to see the other sights of London - Buckingham Palace, Piccadilly Circus, The National Gallery, Downing Street, Big Ben, London Bridge, St. Paul's Cathedral, Tower Bridge, The Tower of London, Westminster Abbey, and possibly see a show.

From London, we travel through the Chunnel to **Paris, France** where you will enjoy the same mix of sightseeing/culture and business seminars at the U.S. Embassy, International Chamber of Commerce and/or World Trade Organization.

From France we travel by train to **Belgium**. Where we tour and visit the EU headquarters in **Brussels** and meet with executives in the Diamond industry in **Antwerp**.

From Belgium we travel in an overnight sleeper train to **Zurich, Switzerland**. After a city tour we will meet with Switzerland’s largest grocery retailer – Migros and Swiss Banking executives. The final tour is a full day "Heidiland" tour goes through Lake Zurich to Rapperswil, the city of roses. We will visit Old Town and its medieval castle then after crossing the Ricken Pass with its views of the Alps we reach Vaduz, the capital of the tiny Principality of **Liechtenstein** in the Toggenberg region.
