Starting in 2004, the Chile Free Trade Agreement reduced tariffs on 97 percent U.S. goods to zero, with all remaining tariffs to be phased out by 2015. Bilateral trade between the United States and Chile totaled more than \$16 billion in 2006, an increase of 154 percent over bilateral trade in 2003, before the Free Trade Agreement took effect. This webinar will give you a broader economic perspective of Chile, as well as specific business opportunities and how to capture them.
